Based on this, it is proposed to continuously enhance the international acceptance and recognition of China's political ideology, actively play a leading and coordinating role in international affairs, innovate propaganda forms, attach importance to the power of folk communication, win the understanding, recognition and support of a wider range of people around the world, and continuously improve the country's cultural soft power and other response strategies.
